



Get Ready, stand up, hook up, Check Static Line, Check Equipment, Sound off for equipment check ... and everyone replies "OK'. Standing at the door ... the light turns red, then turns green; we are above the Drop Zone and this is the GO! A count: 1 thousand, 2 thousand, 3 thousand, 4 thousand, and the violent impact and brutal opening of the parachute. Then the song of silence and the buzz of the aircraft hums on its way. There is something magical at that exact moment.

The ground approaches quickly, 90 seconds of descent and PLF (Parachute Landing Fall) ... We are on the soil of Normandy; I realize that I have an experience of another dimension that only few people have the chance to perform.

#### June 2, 2016:

My 70th jump and it is in a tree that finished my flight and then to the hospital I understand that I will not jump again before long time. But morale is good and my passion even more strengthened.





## The ATLANTIC WALL

The Atlantic Wall was the name given to a massive coastal defensive structure built on Hitler's orders that stretched all the way from Norway, along the Belgium and French coastline to the Spanish border. The Atlantic Wall covered a distance of 1,670 miles and it formed the main part of Hitler's 'Fortress Europe'. The wall was built to repulse an Allied attack on Nazi-occupied Europe — wherever it was planned for. The building of the Wall started in 1942 and ended in 1944. The building project was vast and most of it was done along the French coastline where it was assumed by the Nazi hierarchy that an Allied landing would most likely be

#### Lt. Mehan C47 Crash "easy compagny 506th"

On the evening of June 5th,1944, 1st LT Thomas Meehan boarded the lead C-47 of their formation, Plane #66, to be parachuted in Normandy, along with the company's staff made up of 16 paratroopers, and the C-47's flight crew of five. Piloting the 'Dakota' was Lt. Harold Cappelluto.

Plane #66 had been hit by German ground fire near St Mere Eglise. The plane crashed into the ground between Beuzeville au Plain and Haut Fornel.

Henry Margerie, Mayor of Beuzeville au Plain, witnessed the accident. He also remembers: "As we awakened to Flak shooting and planes flying over the area, I saw a plane close to the village which seemed to be trouble and attempted to land. I lost sight of it for a brief moment and then heard a loud explosion. The plane had crashed on a hedgerow bordering a field near the village. It burnt for three days, and the heat created by the fire made it impossible for us to approach."



# DAY TWO THE ATLANTIC WALL

Using your compass and your map you will drive by yourself in our convoy to reach the first point of rendez-vous where we will make a stop for a lunch around noon at Sainte-Mariedu-Mont.

During the afternoon, will drive in our convoy to visit a part of the ATLANTIC WALL and associated sites. We will come back to our HQ for a debriefing of the day's activities during the dinner and will learn how to pack a parachute.

# Option 1 Mission Pathfinder:

Remember we are in June 1944 somewhere in Normandy...

You will find yourself in the body of a pathfinder of the 101st Airborne 506 PIR, you will drive in two groups to DZ to install the "eureka" system marker. You will be dropped in the dark, in a hostile environment where could be hidden the enemy. The greatest vigilance is required during this operation. The mission accomplished, we will regroup and continue our progression as did the pathfinders on the night of June 5 to 6 to a strategic and historical target.

The markers « EUREKA » are positioned, our progress will take place in the area where the Screaming Eagle made their first contact with the enemy we will spend the rest of the night in a place close from here.

# THEY LANDED HERE ...

# **UTAH BEACH**

Low tide, long way to the shore...

Utah Beach, a site of intense fighting in June 1944, is now a peaceful place, with a cool breeze, the sound of waves hitting the surf, and the site of numerous memorials to those who fought 74 years ago. High on a hill overlooking the beach the Navy is remembered, along with several memories to various Army units that landed on the beach. But on June 6, 2015, room was made for another, the Higgins Boat Monument, a memorial to the little boats and their crews who made the landing and ultimately victory, possible.

1944. Germany has lost the fight for North Africa; her ally Italy has turned allegiances and the Russians have gained momentum in the East. Germany isn't beat yet; her army is still millions strong and her weapons among the most potent, but the nation is at her breaking point. A point the Allies could exploit with a push back onto European continent.



## Ste Marie du Mont UTAH Beach

The landing at Utah was scheduled for 06.30 and the Allied force came from the US 4th Infantry Division. The plan for Utah included an airborne drop by the US 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions at various points two to five miles inland of the beach. Those landing on the beach were scheduled to link up with the paratroopers as soon as was possible. The paratroopers were dropped primarily to secure the main road from Valognes to Carentan and to cause general chaos as they dropped at night at 01.30. German commanders did not know if they were a decoy to a main attack elsewhere or the primary attack force in the area. For this reason, the Germans did not know what forces to deploy against the 82nd and 101st such chaos and uncertainty was perfect for the Allies and precisely why the paratroopers were dropped.

The airborne drop worked well. The sea borne landing did not go to plan - though ironically, a battle against Nature was to be of great value to the Allies. Strong currents meant that the landing craft were taken off of their intended targets on the beach. They landed on the beach, but 2000 meters away from their main landing target. Ironically, this was one of the lesser-defended areas along the entire beach front and the casualties as the Americans came ashore were minimal when compared to Omaha. The most senior American commander on the beach, Brigadier General Theodore Roosevelt told his men that, "We'll start the war from here!" and ordered an advance. By midday, the men of the US 4th Infantry had met up with the men from the 101st Airborne unit. German opposition was swiftly dealt with. By the end of the day, the Americans had advanced about four miles inland and they were about one mile from the 82nd at St. Mère-Eglise, some six miles north

# **Colombiere**

First allies Hospital here on June 1944

According to Captain McKee of the Medical Corps: The castle of Hiesville (Colombière...) was operational from 10 am on D-Day and remained active until D + 3 where it was bombed at night. We lost nearly 30% of our equipment. 11 wounded lost their lives, and the bombing caused 15 wounded among medical personnel.

Advanced elements of the 326th Airborne Medical Company of the 101st Airborne jumped with the infantry around one in the morning on June 6, 1944. This detachment consisted of 4 officers and 45 men. Those who were able to reach this goal established an Aid Station on a farm in Hiesville, near the division's PC about 5 miles from Utah Beach. This group was able to provide early emergency care as well as emergency surgery until the evening of June 7th. He then joined the rest of the company, who arrived a little later on the morning of June 6th as a glider, with his commanding officer, Major William E Barfield, 7 officers and 21 men from the surgical team. They had 4 jeeps and their trailers with them. Although many doctors were injured in the "crash landings" they were able to recover their equipment and join the Château Colombières, a place designated to establish the first field hospital of the division. They arrived there shortly before 7 o'clock, while the paratroopers chased the last Germans from the castle.



#### LA FIERE BRIDGE

"The Bloodiest Small Unit Struggle in the Experience of American Arms"



Located on one of the few routes that German forces to the west of Sainte-Mère-Église could use to assault Utah Beach, the La Fière bridge assumed an importance far out of proportion to its modest size. To seize it, SHAEF had originally assigned two 82nd regiments: Colonel William Ekman's 505th, which would grab the east end, and Colonel George Millett's 507th, which was supposed to seize the western side.

"The DZ selection was one of the worst and most tragic mistakes that Allied pre-invasion strategists made," said Murphy. "Describing this new, wide-open prairie drop, they simply commented: 'ground here probably soft.' The Germans couldn't have conceived a more deadly trap for the paratroopers and glidermen who landed there."



#### **ANGOVILLE AU PLAIN**

Medic Robert E. Wright and his companion Kenneth J. Moore took care of combatants from both sides plus civilian wounded in the local church. When they stumbled on the church during D-Day they posted medical signs around the church to designate it as a field hospital.

Wounded troopers were already in the battleworn village that was captured, recaptured and captured again. Wright and Moore would manage the makeshift field hospital for three days. On the second day two Germans came down from the Bell Tower of the church and indicated they wanted to surrender.

The medics had no idea that there had been armed soldiers in the Angoville au Plain church! They had one golden rule: 'No weapons allowed in the church'. That rule was sacred.

While the battle raged outside the church of Angoville au Plain was a safe haven for them lucky enough to come out of this battle wounded. The medics gave humane and lifesaving care to more than 80 paratroopers, Germans and civilians.





Departure to Carentan and Saint Come du Mont. On our way we will cross the village named Angoville au Plain, we will make a stop at "la Barquette", and we resume the road toward Carentan.

Arrive at Carentan for a typical 1944 lunch.

We plan the visit of the Museum « Dead's Man Corner » and the Dakota simulator, at D-DAY EXPERIENCE.

Depart for Omaha Beach in our convoy. We will drive on road to the sites of landing of the Gi's of the 1st Infantry Division (the famous Big Red One) and the 29th Infantry Division, (known as the Blue and Grey).

We will arrive at Grand Camp Maisy, where we will have the opportunity to discover one of the last seaworthy "Higgin's Boat" and enjoy a ride with his owner.



Dinner and we will stay at our Hotel at Caen.



# La Barquette

## 101st airborne Objective ...

La Barquette is a commune in the commune of Saint-Côme-du-Mont. It is made up of three buildings and a lock on the Douve which represents a key point of the sector since the whole area is flooded by the Germans as early as 1943. During the planning of Operation Overlord, the Allies make different crossing points on the Douve of priority objectives on D-Day: the lock of La Barquette is part of it.

The area is defended by the German soldiers of the 3rd Battalion of the Grenadier-Regiment 1058 (91. Infantry Division). It is the 1st battalion of the 501st Parachute Infantry Regiment (101st Airborne Division) under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel Robert C. Caroll who receives the missions to seize and hold the lock in the early hours of June 6, 1944. La Barquette must be under control to prevent the Germans from counterattacking from this crossing point as well as from opening the lock. Indeed, if the locks are open at high tide, this has the effect of largely flooding the land between Saint-Côme-du-Mont and Carentan, thus limiting the possibilities of displacement.

In order to quickly get to La Barquette, the 1st battalion of the 501st PIR is scheduled to be parachuted about one kilometer north of La Barquette lock on the "D" coded jump zone. The dropping starts on June 6, 1944 at 1 hour 26 ...



# Pointe du HOC

Low tide, on the riff...

Incredibly, paratroopers of the 101st US Airborne Division took part in the coup de main. Initially they had to be parachuted around Sainte-Marie-du-Mont on Utah Beach. Only drops are difficult and perilous. They are 4 of the 506th PIR to have landed on the edge of Pointe du Hoc, about fifteen kilometers as the crow flies from their target. Members of the I Company, their plane crashed at sea after being hit by the Flak and they had to jump precipitately. Lieutenant Floyd Johnston and Para Niels Christensen land on the cliff. Wounded, the lieutenant managed to join the allied lines but Christensen was captured by the Germans. The other two are the paras Raymond Crouch and Leonard Goodgal who pose feet down in 30 centimeters of water. Arriving on the pebbles they follow the shoreline to find a place suitable for climbing and trying to find out where they are.

However, the Allied air and naval bombardment began. Soon they see boats approaching from where other Americans, rangers. Colonel Rudder notices his two men and knows that all the opportunities are to be seized. Two more men will not be too many to help him in his business. Since then Crouch and Goodgal are involved in the attempt to capture the battery of Pointe du Hoc. A great adventure for these two paratroopers who were not to be there...

#### Sherman

The tank M4 is the direct descendant of its predecessor, the M3 Lee, of which it takes up much of the chassis. Work on the tank began on August 29, 1940, just after the decision to put into production the M3. In March 1941, a turret capable of embarking a 75 mm gun was designed and in September the T6 prototype was completed and sent to the Aberdeen test center. Since these are satisfactory, it is decided to launch a mass production of the model.

The manufacturing program involves eleven plants, spread throughout the United States. However, the planned engine group, a 500-hp V8 Ford, is still at the end of testing when production of the first tanks is completed. To remedy this, the US military uses what already exists. As for the M3, several derivatives using propellant groups and different production techniques are therefore developed.

This policy makes it possible to diversify as much as possible sources of supply, especially engines, and to use the capacities of factories without disrupting their working techniques. This flexibility, coupled with the fact that the M4 shares many elements with the M3, allows a very rapid start of production, with a monthly output rate reaching one thousand units by mid-1942.




